Judging Standards Sheet for the IGS State Show 2013

The **Judging Standards Sheet** is a work in progress, but the idea is accepted and should eliminate a lot of the judging problems and complaints from past years.

This Judging Standards Sheet is being developed for use during the judging for the 2013 State Show. By using this sheet, the judging quality will be more consistent from judge to judge. This sheet will be a checklist of categories, and is to allow the judges to evaluate all the art by the same standards. There is also a judge's comment area for good, constructive or explanatory comments.

This sheet will help explain why you did or did not get the placement you thought you should have on your art work. Each entry will have this judging sheet attached discreetly to its entry tag and be for the artist's eyes only.

The ratings for these standards will be: Excellent, Good, Fair and Poor. The categories were developed from the AGS Judging Guidelines, and are:

1. Originality of Design
2. Beauty/Overall Appearance
3. Does Gourd/Class Technique/ Predominate
4. Execution of Technique (If applies)
5. Overall Quality of Craftsmanship
6. Harmony of Colors and Materials
7. Neatness/Cleanness of lines/Design
8. Balance and Scale
9. Creativity and Suitability of Accessories
10. Fit to Competition Class and/or Level
11. Judge's Comments

ARE THERE NOMINEES FOR IGS AWARDS?

The charter members who founded the Indiana Gourd Society decided to show their appreciation to those individuals who went above and beyond their volunteer efforts for the society. This passion for the growing, crafting and promotion of gourds is shown in their efforts. Individuals who have clearly demonstrated this work in any area of the gourd society may be nominated for the Roll of Honor. All nominees must be current or past members of the society. Any current IGS member may make a nomination. Nominations for the Roll of Honor are to be sent to the secretary of IGS on an 8 ½ X 11" sheet of paper; provide specific activities of this individual. The Executive Board will review the nominations. Those found worthy by the Executive Board will

then have their names engraved on the Roll of Honor plaque and will be introduced at the dinner of the annual Indiana Gourd Show. Please send nomination to the Secretary of I.G.S. by February 1 and provide specific examples as to why this nominee should be included on the Roll of Honor.

GOURD PATCHES There is ample space in IGS for additional gourd patches, the groups that meet by interest (growing, painting) or geography to enjoy gourds. The patch application form is available on the IGS web site and rules are simple: apply, be approved by the IGS board, meet, and enjoy gourds. In addition, a \$100 grant is available from the IGS board for any group that wants to host a gourd event and needs startup funding.

The Sugar Creek Gourd Patch meets the first and third Wednesday from 6-8:00 p.m. at the Thorntown (IN) Public Library. From three to twelve members attend and in early September a major gourd cleaning evening was held in spite of the chill. Decouping Gourds©

An interesting medium for crafting gourds is decouping. It is as good for beginners as it is for advanced crafters. It is very versatile, in that you can use a variety of materials. It is a very forgiving medium, in that you can totally start over without foregoing your original gourd, if you should happen to mess up your first attempt, or your second or third!

Supplies you will need:

- A cleaned gourd.
- A decoupage glue, such as Modge Podge, etc. (I use Golden Gel Medium, which comes in four consistencies - soft, regular, heavy and extra heavy, and can be purchased at Michael's).
- A material or choice of materials to decoupage.

Some possibilities are: pressed flowers/foilage, papers of all kinds (thinner papers do best), cloth, pictures.

- Waxed paper, newspapers.

Procedure:

- (1) Put newspapers down on your working surface.
- (2) Look at your gourd and decide what decouped material would best suit this gourd. You may have something specific you would like to try for... OR, you might just like to start out and see what happens ! You might be pleasantly surprised.
- (3) If you are using pressed flowers/leaves that are so brittle they might break easily, you might want to soak them in water for a bit (15-20 minutes, depending on how dry and brittle they are).

(4) Work on waxed paper. Apply material in small amounts by brushing on the glue or get medium onto the back side of the material. Pieces can usually be moved and rearranged for a minute or two after being placed on the gourd. And, of course, you may cover any "mistakes" any time by gluing another piece over the existing piece.

(5) After gluing each piece, go back over it with another coating of glue, being sure to seal the edges.

(6) After you have completed gluing all the pieces into their proper places, let the project dry thoroughly, then feel to see if you have any loose edges. They will feel rough to your touch. If so, give the

piece another layer of glue. Repeat until the gourd feels smooth all over.

(7) Then dry thoroughly and add a coat of acrylic spray, if you like.

Add interest:

After you have got "the hang" of decoupage, try adding some other techniques with the decoupage technique. For example, you can paint or leather dye the gourd before you add the decoupage material. Try adding colored pencil or ink (don't forget the spray!). I like to woodburn a design, color it with oil pencils, then add some decoupage pieces. In fact, you can combine decoupage with just about any other technique. Experiment! And enjoy!

It is time to think about what you are going to do with all of your gourds in preparation for the coming Spring Festival and State Show.
