GOURD EDUCATION FLOURISHES

The car is loaded with six large totes of gourds and a bushel basket gourd that also serves as a bin for supplies and smaller decorated gourds. Another new experience is happening: talking about gourds to students in grades 7-12 at Decatur Discovery Academy on South High School Road in Indianapolis. Teacher Betsy Carpenter-Wilson teaches a horticulture class and in the fall the students work on art made from nature. She acquired an assortment of gourds and the students cleaned them in mid-November. Although many are bird house gourds, I can never resist taking along an assortment of gourds, especially smaller ones, for show 'n tell. After providing a brief bit of information on types, history, and uses of gourds, we focus on decorating techniques. What an adrenaline high results from talking about

Judging Standards Sheet for the IGS State Show 2013

The **Judging Standards Sheet** is a work in progress, but the idea is accepted and should eliminate a lot of the judging problems and complaints from past years.

This Judging Standards Sheet is being developed for use during the judging for the 2013 State Show. By using this sheet, the judging quality will be more consistent from judge to judge. This sheet will be a checklist of categories, and is to allow the judges to evaluate all the art by the same standards. There is also a judge's comment area for good, constructive or explanatory comments.

This sheet will help explain why you did or did not get the placement you thought you should have on your art work. Each entry will have this judging sheet attached discreetly to its entry tag and be for the artist's eyes only.

The ratings for these standards will be: Excellent, Good, Fair and Poor. The categories were developed from the AGS Judging Guidelines, and are:

1. Originality of Design
2. Beauty/Overall Appearance
3. Does Gourd/Class Technique/ Predominate
4. Execution of Technique (If applies)
5. Overall Quality of Craftsmanship
6. Harmony of Colors and Materials
7. Neatness/Cleanness of lines/Design
8. Balance and Scale
9. Creativity and Suitability of Accessories
10. Fit to Competition Class and/or Level
11. Judge's Comments

Judging and Competition at the 2013 IGS State Show

I would like to explain or clarify some of the concerns that have been made in the past about the Judging and Competition at the IGS Shows. IGS is going to follow the **AGS Guidelines, option "C"** again for 2013. Please see the AGS website, judging handbook for the option "C" guidelines.

ALL Judges and Artist and Members need to be made aware of 2 things.... there are **Judging Guidelines** and **Competitions Rules**. The AGS Judging Guidelines are supposed to standardize the judging from one show/state to the other. Whichever option the Show uses A, B, or C, they should all use the same GUIDELINES. The Competition Rules are set up by the individual Show/State and can be very different from one Show/State to the other. This is why it is very important to READ the show book and it's RULES very carefully.

The IGS Competition Rules are already set....they are the rules set in the BOX below each Division, in the show book. These were addressed for last year's book. At the 2013 book meeting, only a few words were changed for clarification.

I have competed in 4 different state's, and have Judged/Clerked in 3 of these States. They ALL have different COMPETITION RULES to follow. So it's very important to READ that States Competition Rules very carefully before you choose your gourd entries for the competitions. Also check to see what AGS Judging option is to be used for that show.

Our Judges and out-of-state Judges may not be familiar with IGS Competition Rules, nor had an IGS Show Book to read. I feel that All Judges should be sent a copy of the **AGS Judging Guideline, option C**, and a copy of the **IGS Competition Rules** before the show, to study. This information will be part of the Judges' meeting on Friday before judging starts.

A discussion between the Head Judge and the Show Chair will take place before the show. This will be about whom and how to handle the Judging and what will be talked about at the judges' meeting on Friday night before judging starts. Some things to be discuses are: AGS Guidelines for Option "C", AGS guidelines for disqualification, when/why to call the head judge, what to do if you know the artist or can not judge fairly, Judges to be aware of unfamiliar art techniques used, and others things.

Your comments and concerns are appreciated and will be considered in all decisions. Send me your comments. I want the IGS State Show 2013 to be the BEST, Best Judged, and Hassle Free Show ever.

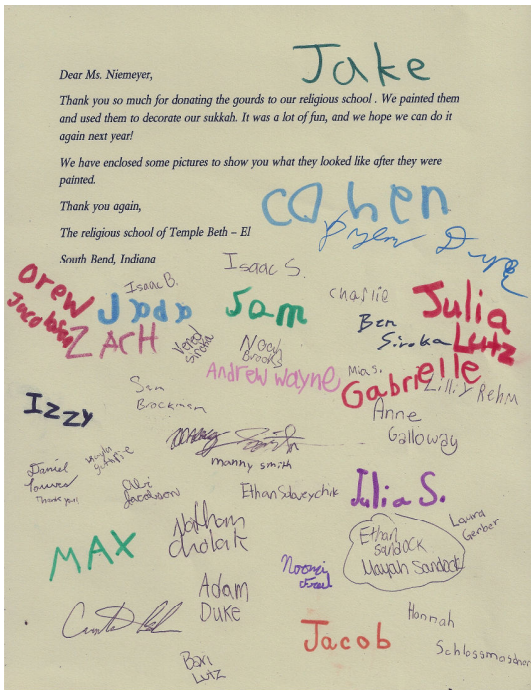

when it is time to again box up and hit the road for gourd education. I am asking members to let me know where they have been providing gourd education programs. One of the things I find interesting is the variety of venues in which we and our gourds are included.

Because three from my gourd patch on October 6 were going to be at the Colfax Public Library at an autumn art fair, where we could sell, display, demonstrate, and teach, I thought to ask Ruth Moorhead for a summary of her speaking on the subject of gourds. She reported:

“October 3, I spoke to the Women’s Department Club of the Marion Sunnycrest Methodist Church, a return gig, this time on the history of and crafting with gourds. 50 members attended. My ‘speech’ was 35 minutes, but they kept asking questions for 45 minutes more. I emphasized the website for project information.

(From that I got a June date for 2013, for the same program but a different group.) I also talked about Bible reference to gourds.

On Oct. 4, I spoke with the Ft. Benjamin Blossoms garden club, 36 present, men and women, great response, included sex in the gourd garden along with the history and basic craft prep. One of their members brought several dried gourds that he had grown a few years ago, and gave to those interested. That made a great connection to my commercial for Nov. 3 {IGS fall festival}. Indy people will go to Parke Co. Anyway, they really enjoyed my presentation, enthusiasm, and humor. [Those of you who know Ruth can identify with that last line.]

On Oct. 6, Phil [Moorhead], Jesse [Glessner] and I will be at Ivy Tech’s hort expo with a gourd booth. I never unloaded the van, so I have stuff to display and talk about. I hope they move it indoors, but I’m dressing for 45 degrees. Will bring Sweetie [charming little black poodle] in her [lime green] gourd hat.

If I remember, I’ll cut male and female blossoms, too.



On Oct. 24th, I do a birdhouse gourd program at Marion’s library for the Community Garden people. They’ve downloaded instructions from the website to distribute. I’ll talk about cleaning, sanding, prep, etc., and bring a few demos. They grew birdhouse gourds this year and want to craft and sell for next year to make money for the needs of the gardens. Might be a good off-

shoot for a “patch”. I’ll bring membership info.

That ends this year’s talks as far as I now have scheduled.”

On September 3 Sandlady Helen Thomas again held her all-day festival near Tangier and had her gourd museum open to the public. In September Carolyn Rushton talked about gourds with Master Gardeners in Rushville and on November 17-18 Emily Wallace and crew will take part in the Autumn Art Fair at the Garfield Park Conservatory in Indianapolis. IGS members Mac McCrary and Diane Werblo chair this annual artistic event.

Being IGS President has provided me with many, many opportunities to provide gourd education. On a lovely fall Saturday on September 22, I drove to Shelbyville to provide an educational display booth full of gourds as well as a “Gourds from Seed to Art” talk from 10-11:00 a.m. at a Master Gardeners open air market on the town square. The response was positive and it was a time to promote IGS membership and events as well. In addition, I shall pay a return visit on April 27, 2013, when the Master Gardeners will again have a grand event, this one inside their fairground buildings. Saturday, April 13, will be a unique experience for me: talking with approximately 30 of 120 people who attend the Hoosier Recreation Workshop in Camby. The attendees will be people who want to go back to their home groups (Scouting, 4-H, church, etc.) and teach them the art form; most will be adults but a few high school students may attend the three-day workshop designed to introduce people to new types of recreation and crafts.

During Thorntown’s Festival of the Turning Leaves Sept. 27-29, we filled the meeting room hallway of the public library with new gourd projects and those that had been entered in the Boone County Fair in July. Our Sugar Creek Gourd Patch had on July 18 enjoyed learning crayon art from Pat Moore (with the blessing of Arizona’s Miriam Joy Sagan, who had taught Pat) Gourd projects from simple to complex fill the case.

One of my challenges is to keep the speaking schedule straight. In September, October, and November I have provided talks on the Boone County Barn Quilt Project and three days after the last quilt talk I shifted into a gourd talk. I have thought about putting a gourd quilt block on a piece of 4 x 4’ medium density overlay board, but that would be much more challenging to haul around the state than six tubs of gourd art!

AWARDS—Just a reminder that Roll of Honor nominations are due to secretary Kirsten DeHaven, 6254 S. 350 W., Rossville, IN 46065 by February 1. Any current IGS member may make a nomination on an 8 ½ x 11” sheet of paper and should describe specific activities of the nominee. These activities may include growing, crafting and promotion of gourds and the nominee should be an individual who has gone “above and beyond” in volunteer efforts in behalf of IGS. The nominee must be a current or past member of IGS. The Executive Board will review nominations, have the name engraved on the Roll of Honor plaque, and the winner(s) be introduced at the Saturday evening dinner at the state show on May 4.

LOST GOURDS RETURNED HOME: To date the elephant head and two miniature bowls have been returned to their artists after being left at the 2012 state show. Photographs in [The Tendril](#) greatly helped in that process.
