"Gourdspiration" Karen Niemeyer

Although we "gourdheads" try our best to remain sensible year 'round, the closer we get to the days of our state gourd show, the more the anticipation builds. This year we would like gourd enthusiasts to feel free to bring a few reruns to the May 4-5 show. That is, do bring items for competition, but also bring (with identifying labels) any gourds that were previously exhibited and thus not eligible to return for competition. Provide your name and any special information about the project on a white 3 x 5" index card. My thinking is that some have never seen that particular entry and some of us saw it many years ago and would enjoy seeing it again. There is no limit-until we run out of display space, so let us see some of these oldies-but-goodies again.

It would also be acceptable to bring a gourd that was not previously entered but that you think would be interesting for us to see. Likewise, a hat, musical instrument, mask, piece of gourd-adorned clothing, or a jewelry item that was previously entered for our parade may be brought back for another look and placed on the display tables.

For this year's parade, the items in competition must have been made by the exhibitor. Last year I lay aside the hat I had made in favor of wearing one made by Jim Story, one of our Society's founders. This year I'll plan to wear one of my own making. Some of you will remember when we also had pet gourd hat contests; one of my display cabinets still includes a gourd hat made for a miniature dachshund. It causes me to wonder...have other states had gourd hat contests for pets?

There will be a wide variety of demonstrations at the show on Friday or Saturday and the length will vary, as may the location. Visitors will be welcome to come and go (continued next column)

Included will be pine needle art on a gourd by Michelle Fife, dot painting by Diane Werblo, weaving on a small pin by Mac McCrary, gourd seed art by Sandra Townsend, chip carving by Jim Bennett, manipulating gourds by Jim Ballard, decoupage by Peggy Miller, wood burning by Ron Pressel, and seeds in general by Ida Kennedy.

Several Make-It-Take-It sessions are also being planned and these will be posted at the entrance so that visitors may make plans for their time at the show. There will be a fee for making these projects, but kits may also be purchased to make at home instead of during the show. Construction of an elephant, a ladybug, a bee/bug pot hanger/peeper, and shard magnets, pins, necklaces will be among the possibilities Techniques for these MITI's will include rub-on transfers, inks and acrylics — and more.

Make plans now to enjoy the 26th annual gourd show at the Fulton County Historical Society in Rochester, as that focus has caused the IGS to generate this early newsletter with show details. See you there!
