A MORAL LESSON FROM GOURDS Karen Niemeyer

As I was scrubbing spinner gourds in preparation for their use in the Society's booth at the Indiana State Fair for 17 days in August, I was struck by the lessons they teach us. Although gourds get pretty distressed in appearance after the exterior starts molding and peeling, with gentle care and repeated contact, the gourd becomes attractive and useful. If treated roughly, it may be damaged. Even when damaged, it may still be useful, but it may be a mini bowl instead of a spinner. Even if they do not function well as spinners, they may be great for other purposes, such as necklaces and mobiles. Is that not like our human race? Once I had a gourd shrivel as it dried, and it instead became a granny apple face for a doll; instead of its intended purpose, it served a different one. I don't think I want to carry this analogy further and try discussing seeds and gourd guts!! It could be good sermon material, I think.

We had a great crop of display gourds for the Indiana State Fair and it is always wonderful to see the variety on display. We owe a big THANKS to the volunteers who set up and work the booth, thus informing many others about the wonder of gourds. As we polled members a few years ago, we discovered that many discovered the Indiana Gourd Society through the state fair display.

In July we concluded another Boone County 4 -H Fair and Open Show. This year there were 14 gourd entries. This is only the third year that gourds have had their own class *Gourd Art* in the open show. When we gourders first started entering gourds, they had to be entered as a *Miscellaneous Hobby* in the Arts and Crafts Department. There were seven artists in gourds this year instead of just one—good progress.

Sugar Creek and Thorn Tree Gourd Patches (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

Anyone who wants to work with these amazing dried grouds is welcome to the gourd patch sessions at the Thorntown Public Library, 124 N. Market St., Thorntown. Crafting sessions are held from 2-4:00 p.m. ET on the second and fourth Wednesdays and from 6-8 p.m. ET on the first and third Wednesdays each month. In addition to working on special projects, participants are invited to work on their own gourd pieces while sharing gourd conversations. In August, participants will either help clean spinner gourds for future fairs and the state show or work on individual projects. On September 5 and 19 at 6:00 p.m. ET the plan is to work on quilt squares and on September 12 and 26 to experiment with making rain sticks. On October 3 and 17 at 6:00 p.m. ET we shall be finishing our gourd lamps and working on individual projects while on October 10 and 24 at 2:00 p.m. ET we shall make the aromatherapy necklace as featured in the spring issue of the AGS gourd magazine. November 7 and 21 will be a time to work on snowmen of various styles, while on November 14 and 24 the plan is to finish gourd lamps and snowmen. The December sessions will be a time to finish quilt squares, finish other projects, and do-you-own-thing. At any session participants may DYOT. There is no meeting planned for Dec. 26. It is all gourd fun! It was especially great fun to have seven artists and 14 exhibits at the Boone County Fair Open Show in July and to have wins at the Indiana State Fair for several patch members: Sandra and Tim Townsend, Sally Mohringer, Karen Niemeyer, Denise Bechtold, Earlene Stanifer, Jim and Joyce Bennett, and Annette Knox.
